Chapter 63: AI Literacy and AI Tools in Clinical Practice

- ☐ Before first use, confirmed the student knows which AI tools are approved and actively in use on this specific unit — ambient documentation, EHR-embedded risk scores, clinical decision support — rather than assuming general orientation covered this
 - ☐ Student can explain, in their own words, what the tool is actually doing ("this drafts a note from the conversation," not "it charts for me")
 - ☐ Student independently verifies at least one AI-generated output against the primary source — their own assessment, the patient's actual chart data — before accepting it
 - ☐ Student can describe what they would do if an AI output looked wrong, and understands that questioning it is expected, not a sign they misunderstood the tool
 - ☐ Any AI-assisted note or recommendation is reviewed and co-signed per your institution's policy — the AI output does not carry independent authority
 - ☐ Debrief explicitly: ask what the AI got right, what it missed, and how the student would have caught an error without you there
